Have a listen to all of the different nature sounds that you can hear. What colours can you see? Have a look at the sky, bushes, trees, birds, butterflies etc. When you get back home draw a picture of something that you noticed on your walk.</p>	<p align="center"><u>½ of an animal plus ½ of an animal</u></p> <p>If you could invent a new animal what would it be? Draw a picture of 2 animals that you have put together, to make your new animal. Give your new animal a new name. For example if you combined a dolphin with an elephant, you would have a 'dolphant'.
