4. Water falling?

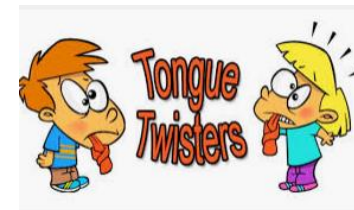


## TONGUE TWISTING MADNESS!
