A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

Exceptions: For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact the Principal if you would like to discuss this.


Emergencies: In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

8 ATTENDANCE

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day - missing school puts them behind.

There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital, though, that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick. It's also vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided. **Every day counts.**

On the 23rd of February, Mr Taylor (our Design & Digital Technologies teacher) and some Grade 4 students made two kinds of pasta. The project was in preparation for Term 2, when students from multiple year levels will have a go at making their own pasta. Students made an egg-based dough, which they rolled out on a pasta machine and then cut into shapes of their choosing. They also made cavatelli – a ricotta-based pasta that is produced by a hand-cranked machine. The pastas were served with vegetables, which students also had a hand in preparing.

The 'Design and Technologies' curriculum talks about food production, and we've decided we'll explore that by giving students hands-on experience with artisanal flours, masa harina (the corn flour used to make tortillas), and staples such as eggs. The curriculum also sees students learning about tools and mechanisms - hence the mixture of familiar tools (knives and cookie cutters) and less common tools (cavatelli makers and tortilla presses).

Room 3 and Room 13 had their first buddy session last week and it went very well. Each group had an activity prepared by their year five buddies. The year five students demonstrated excellent leadership skills and care in looking after their foundation buddies. They ensured every child was included and some even differentiated their activity so their foundation buddy would enjoy it! Ms Bonnell and Ms Borg were so proud of everyone, and they all had such a fun time together. This activity aligns with the Berry Street Education Model being implemented at River Gum Primary School. Building relationships with peers and teachers helps to foster a sense of connectedness with school and engagement in learning.

Our school has partnered with an independent provider called **TheirCare** to provide exceptional Outside School Hours Care services for our school community.

The program is available for all children at River Gum Primary School from 6:30am until 8:35am in the morning and from 3:15pm until 6:30pm each school day. During School Holidays & Pupil Free Days the service will operate from 6:30am until 6:30pm.

Families wishing to use this service can visit the TheirCare website: www.theircare.com.au Families are eligible for a Government Rebate called the Child Care Subsidy which can reduce the cost per session by up to 90%.

TheirCare provides a stimulating and safe environment for all children. During sessions, children develop life-skills, friendships, confidence and creativity through play-based programs.
