

10 LIFELONG LEARNING

Fluency in Foundation

In Foundation this term, students have been getting ready and familiar with our fluency lesson structure. Students have been investigating sounds in a multi-sensory approach, building letter name fluency and have been explicitly taught rhyming words.

These skills are part of our Orton Gillingham Multi-sensory Structured Learning approach. This approach is scientific based and all senses (seeing, hearing, touching and moving) are activated at the same time. This ensures students develop essential literacy skills such as sound and letter knowledge, handwriting, phonics, spelling rules and oral language.

Fluency lessons in Foundation occur for one hour each day.

Camps, Sports and Excursion Funding - Applications for 2024

If your student(s) does not currently receive CSEF and you hold a valid healthcare/concession card, you may be eligible to apply for CSEF Funding at River Gum PS.

CSEF is an annual payment which is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. 2024 CSEF Application Form attached for completion.

If you have applied for CSEF at River Gum PS in previous years you do not need to fill out a new form in 2024.

Students who currently receive the CSEF and who remain eligible will have their 2024 application automatically processed.

If your student is new to River Gum Primary School or if you have a new student in your family starting in 2024 you will need to complete a new form.

If you are unsure whether you have completed a form previously, you may complete this form again to ensure we have your current details.

Eligibility

· Primary school student rate: \$150 per year

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two

a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;

b) submit an application to the school by the due date, 28th June 2024.

Our school has partnered with an independent provider called **TheirCare** to provide exceptional Outside School Hours Care services for our school community.

The program is available for all children at River Gum Primary School from 6:30am until 8:35am in the morning and from 3:15pm until 6:30pm each school day.

During School Holidays & Pupil Free Days the service will operate from 6:30am until 6:30pm.

Families wishing to use this service can visit the TheirCare website: www.theircare.com.au Families are eligible for a Government Rebate called the Child Care Subsidy which can reduce the cost per session by up to 90%.

TheirCare provides a stimulating and safe environment for all children. During sessions, children develop life-skills, friendships, confidence and creativity through play-based programs.
